My primary responsibility is to support members of the faculty in their academic research: typical tasks include statistical consulting, programming and analysis; extracting data from commercial or other databases, from text documents and web scraping; analyzing data and writing routines to perform interactive data vizualization and to calculate statistical formulas not yet implemented in common statistical packages. In this role, I have worked with faculty in the fields of marketing, finance, accounting, operations and management and strategy, and have analyzed data for the administration relating incoming students' characteristic to subsequent performance.

In addition, with the support and encouragement of my supervisors, I have conducted my own research which has focused on the effects of a minimum wage (MW). This has led to: several publications in top peer-reviewed journals: <u>an award-winning</u> book "What Does the Minimum Wage Do?" that is a survey of the very large 21st century English language literature on the effects of the MW in developed economies: and a survey for the International Labor Organization of studies on the MW experiences of developing countries which has been used as a key reference by the ILO for its global policy guide on setting the MW.

The book is often cited in policy debates and newspaper articles and has been acknowledged as one of the most comprehensive and objective works on the MW to date. I have presented findings at professional conferences (AEA/ASSA, LERA, MAER-Net) and to a variety of audiences at both the national and international level, including at the ILO Regulating for Decent Work Conference and conferences organized by governments and social partners, such as the AFL-CIO and the International Forum in Mexico City, which took place in the context of policy debates about raising the MW. My research has attracted wide attention in the media and I am often called by journalists for who want to better understand this important and topical policy issue, as well as for my views on specific MW initiatives.

Now called The Food Industry Center, this is one of more than two dozen Sloan Foundation industry centers modeled after the MIT International Automobile Program and established to study specific industries for the purpose of understanding and disseminating best practices. While I worked there, the primary focus was the grocery and supermarket sector. Sloan emphasized the creation of new data and to that end, the major project at TRFIC, and my biggest single responsibility, was the establishment and execution of *The Supermarket Panel*, a statistically sound annual survey of supermarkets.
